Grasslands are for the Birds

Grassland communities in eastern Montana provide some of the last vestiges of native prairie



in the U.S. Birds such as Sprague's Pipit and Baird's Sparrow depend on intact grassland habitats. Fish, Wildlife & Parks is developing a strategy to provide a statewide focus on grassland conservation and coordination with conservation partners. Protecting and restoring grasslands is the objective to provide habitat for grasslandassociated wildlife. The focus of this presentation will be the status of grasslands, grassland birds and the conservation of these habitats.



Our speaker, Allison Begley, is the Avian Conservation Biologist for Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks. She graduated from the University of Alberta with an MSc in 2002 after working on wetland restoration. She has been a biologist with the department for over 13 years, and coordinates the Montana Bird Conservation Partnership as part of her duties.

On Working Together

Think of a spider's web. Visualize the spider quietly situated in the middle of the web, with each of her eight legs taking the pulse of a sticky strand. An unsuspecting housefly or bumblebee flies into the net, and the spider immediately picks-up the vibration, like a telegraph code, and rushes to the scene to secure her prey; a quick response means a reward of a meal.

We are developing that sort of communication between the nine state chapters of Audubon through the Chapter Relations Committee of the Montana Audubon Board. Having just met in mid-September, we are developing means of communication so we can share what's working for our chapter and glean ideas from the State office and other chapters about what the potential is for action in the great state of Montana.

Besides the web of action within the Audubon circle, we also have a web for our GEMS Project (Golden Eagle Migration Survey Project), working in concert with the US Forest Service, MT FWP, Montana Audubon and Last Chance Audubon. Each entity brings their expertise to the table and so much is accomplished more efficiently than if we were to shoulder the project ourselves.

And, within our chapter we have a core of people covering the various tasks that make for a vibrant chapter, communicating efforts so the vibration ripples out for the benefit of all.
